In today's Gospel, we hear that some Greeks "would like to see Jesus." Jesus then explains that His disciples must follow Him and serve, while He would "draw everyone to myself." Being drawn to Jesus as intentional disciples is what we have been considering as we continue to delve into Leonard Doohan's insights in *The Lay-Centered Church*.

"The Church is a family. To be Church, to live as Church, means to live as a part of this family, aware that we need others. No one is complete in isolation, and no member can be left out. What is true of the layperson's family is true of the Church as well. There must be unity and respect for all members, a mutual appreciation among all, and a freedom for the adults of the group...In each person there must be an irrevocable personal commitment to the group, and all must contribute actively to its life, since each one has a task to fulfill. We can only be Church today and be relevant to the world in which we live when we tap and develop the rich variety of people's gifts from the Spirit."

"An important aspect of recognizing the gifts of others lies in leading them to recognize and use their gifts themselves...Our faith in the Church needs to be expressed in all the members of this family working together...Where lay responsibility is absent the Church is incomplete...Each baptized person has both the right and the responsibility to cooperate in the Church's mission to the world, as well as the right and responsibility to contribute to the inner life and organization of the ecclesial community... There is always tension between what spirituality was in a previous generation and what it needs to be today and tomorrow."

While discussing trends in how church is viewed Doohan writes, "...the basis of all these trends is the realization that all the baptized are called to see the intimate unity between their faith and the fulfillment of their daily obligations."

Next week we'll continue with Doohan's book as we celebrate Palm Sunday.

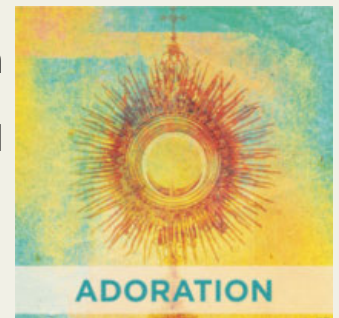

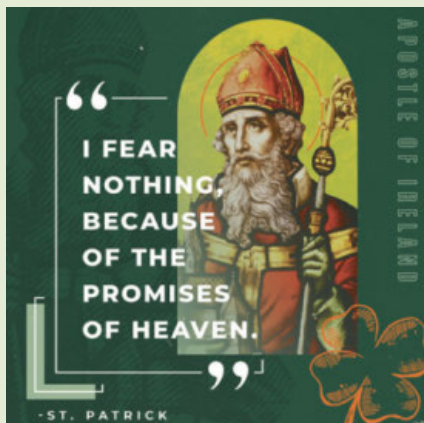

Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We now have available low-gluten hosts which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.
