

Today's gospel highlights the importance of Sabbath practice. Jesus tells the apostles: "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." The Son of God recognizes that daily life demands a lot from disciples then and now. To-do lists never stop growing. Our callings may pull us in many directions, a reality that makes the practice of Sabbath even more necessary. To pause from work and worry, if even for an afternoon, can renew energy for the day-to-day grind. To worship, withdraw, wonder, walk, and welcome others draws us closer to God.

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel argued that the practice of Sabbath is not just a nice idea. It is a necessity, a command from God. Heschel wrote, "Unless one learns how to relish the taste of Sabbath ... one will be unable to enjoy the taste of eternity in the world to come." Practicing Sabbath enables us to live into the fullness of our callings by restoring our bodies and minds. Whether practiced for a day or an hour, Sabbath invites us to listen to the song of God's Spirit. How might you answer Jesus' invitation to rest awhile this week? (Living Liturgy)



At a recent weekday, Mass Fr. Binu mentioned that Christianity is currently the most persecuted religion in the world. Living as intentional disciples of Jesus is not as easy as it was a few decades ago. In order to be an effective disciple we unfortunately have to be counter-cultural in many ways. Jesus' message has never changed, "Love God and love your neighbor as yourself." Doing so involves intestinal fortitude and a

willingness to sometimes feel we're not part of the "in crowd." We recognize the benefits of the Kingdom of God, but we don't necessarily feel we're experiencing them now in the "What's in it for me" society.

Matthew Kelly, a popular Catholic author, has a recommendation for dealing with life's stresses. He wrote *Holy Moments* which he describes as a "handbook for the rest of your life." He writes:

"Once we discover that some moments are holy, some moments are unholy, and our choices can guide a moment in either direction, life finally begins to make sense. This is no small thing. Most people in the modern secular world cannot make sense of life. The culture has exiled them from God, religion, and spirituality. So, each day is a frustrated attempt to put together the jigsaw puzzle of life without crucial pieces. We are baffled by life. This bewilderment is deeply personal, because we are not only struggling to make sense of life in general, but we are struggling to make sense of our own lives. The more disconnected from God our lives become the more meaningless life becomes.

Holy Moments give meaning and divine purpose to our lives. Meaning is crucial to our health and happiness. We cannot thrive as human beings without it. And we cannot live a meaningful life by filling our life with trivial things and meaningless activities."



Baptism Information: Baptisms are celebrated on the second & fourth Sunday of each month. A pre-Baptism program must be attended by the parents. Please call the rectory to register for a program.

Marriage Information: Please call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months (a year is preferred) in advance of the wedding date. It is recommended you do not rent reception facilities until your wedding date is confirmed with the pastor. Your preferred wedding date may be unavailable, and we do not want you to lose your deposit with the reception venue.

Parish Registration: New families are welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Also, previously registered parishioners are asked to notify us of any address changes.

Emergency Sick or Anointing Calls: Please notify us immediately of any serious illness in your family. If you have a hospitalized loved one who would

like a visit, please call the rectory with contact information since the hospitals and hospices no longer notify parishes. Please do not wait until the last minute to have someone anointed. There are always accidents/ emergencies, but sometimes there is less panic when the anointing can be done prior to someone passing.

We have low-gluten hosts available which make it possible for people who have celiac disease or allergies to wheat or gluten to be able to receive communion. If you have celiac disease or an allergy to wheat or gluten, please let us know before Mass so that arrangements can be made for you to be able to receive communion at Mass.

Jesus's heart is moved with "pity" for the crowds. This is perhaps better translated as compassion or mercy. Jesus sees in the crowds a deep hunger for a shepherd, someone to lead them into the promise of a better tomorrow. The Son of God allows himself to be interrupted by the needs of the crowd. 
